Overview

In 2015, the 84th Legislature passed Senate Bill 1812 (SB 1812), a transparency bill that mandates the Comptroller of Public Accounts to create an online eminent domain database. SB 1812 amended Government Code, Section 2206.151-157, requiring public and private entities with eminent domain authority to report specific information to the Comptroller for posting. This is the alpha-numeric user ID used to log on for any report filings you do on eSystems/ WebFile. If you are new to filing reports with the Comptroller's Office, please create a new user ID. This ID is unique to the person filing, not to the entity for which you are reporting.



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- 4 If you have an existing user ID and this is the first time you have logged on since Feb. 1, 2021, you may be prompted to set up three security questions for future user ID or password recovery:

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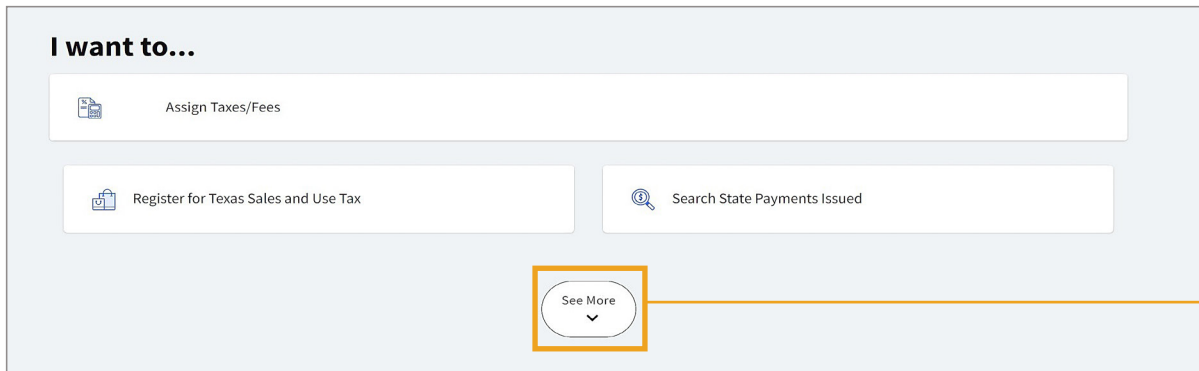


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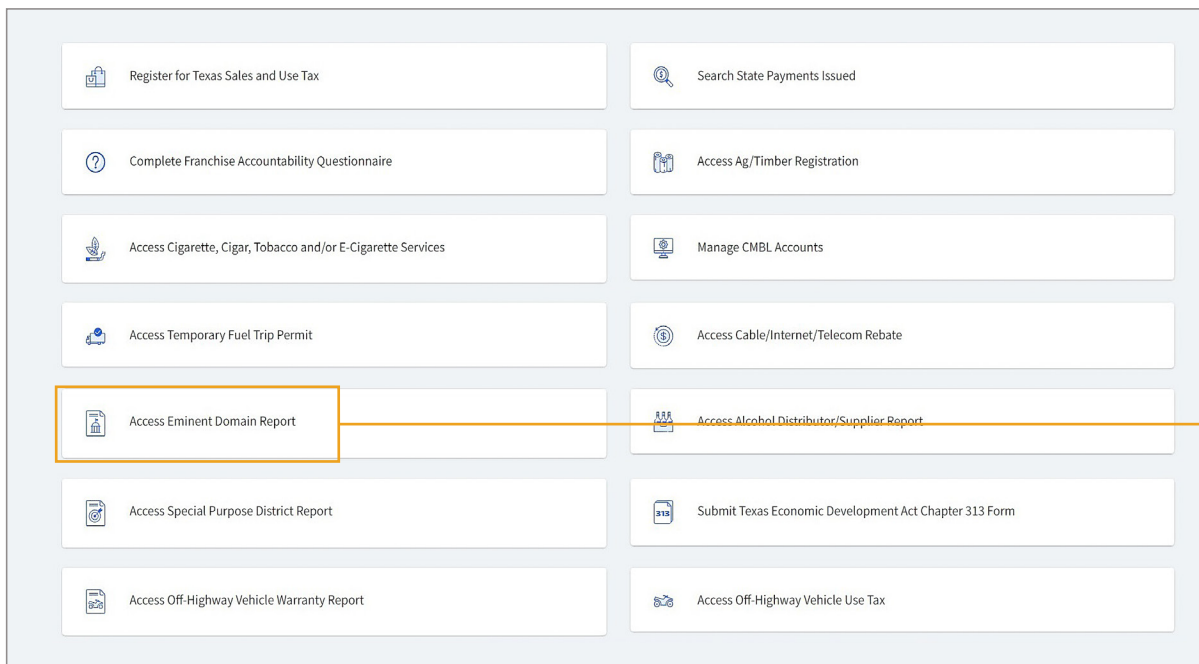
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- 5 After you have successfully logged in, you will see a dashboard screen that may look something like what is shown below. Look for and select the “See More” button:



- 6 That will reveal a list of more reports you can select. In that list, look for “Access Eminent Domain Report.”

- 7 To update a previously filed report, click on "Continue".
